Carmen Barroso is Regional Director of the International Planned Parenthood Federation/ Western Hemisphere Region. Prior, she was a professor of sociology at the University of Sao Paulo, and a senior researcher with the Carlos Chagas Foundation, where she created Brazil's first and foremost women's studies center. She was also a Presidential appointee to the National Council on Women's Rights. Dr. Barroso has been recognized by the media and academics for the role she played in making health and human rights central to development policy at the 1994 ICPD. She has consulted for numerous international and intergovernmental agencies and has served on several boards and international commissions.

Oluwafunmilola (Lola) Dare is an epidemiologist, community physician, social development consultant and CEO of the Centre for Health Sciences Training, Research and Development (CHESTRAD), Nigeria, as well as member of the High-level task force of ICPD. In 2009, Ms. Dare was awarded an honorary membership of the Faculty of Public Health, United Kingdom, by distinction; and Fellow of the same Faculty by distinction in 2011. She was also Chair of the Technical Evaluation Reference Group of the Global Fund, Southern Civil Society Representative on the International Health Partnership Plus (IHP+) and is consultant for various agencies and governments working in Africa.

Gamal Serour is Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology and Director of the International Islamic Center for Population Studies and Research (IICPSR), Al Azhar University. He organized and co-chaired the sixth International meeting in Cairo 2005 of the RCOG and lead the IICPSR work on reproductive health, population policy and education, women's rights, empowerment of women, sexual health and children's rights in developing countries. He authored and co-authored more than 300 hundred papers and 21 chapters in books. He is member of the WHO Scientific Group on Recent advances in Antiretroviral Therapy; and former member of IPPF International Medical Advisory Panel; Intergovernmental Bioethics Committee UNESCO and the International Bioethics Committee UNESCO.
